

Ronald C.C. Cuming

Professor Ronald C.C. Cuming, Q.C., is a professor of law at the University of Saskatchewan. He is a Canadian national who has 38 years of professional experience as a professor of commercial law and 20 years experience as an international consultant to the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank and other international agencies. His work has principally involved advising national governments in the design of legal structures that facilitate economic development. He was the originator and consultant in the development of the Convention on International Interests in Mobile Equipment, 2001, the first international system of substantive secured financing and leasing law in history. He drafted secured financing law that is now in force in most common law provinces and territories of Canada. He has published books and journal articles on secured transactions and insolvency law.
