Stacy Feuer is a legal advisor on international consumer protection issues at the Federal Trade Commission, the primary federal consumer protection agency in the United States. In that capacity, she has worked on numerous international consumer policy and law enforcement issues including issues relating to jurisdiction, choice of law, enforcement of judgments, and dispute resolution and redress. She represents the FTC in various international organizations including the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) -specifically, the Committee on Consumer Policy, the International Consumer Protection and Enforcement Network (ICPEN), and the Organization of American States (OAS). Ms. Feuer joined the FTC in 2000. Before then, she was a partner in the Washington, D.C. law firm, where she specialized in international commercial fraud litigation and represented the worldwide liquidators of BCCI in the largest international banking scandal to date. She also clerked for a US federal district court judge. Ms. Feuer is a graduate of Cornell University and the New York University School of Law.
