Background: Efforts under Pillar IV are related to promoting sustainable business practices and environmental cooperation. During the Third and Fourth Ministerial, the *Pathways to Prosperity Initiative* member countries demonstrated a strong commitment to improving cooperation on the adoption of sound environmental practices, including sustainable business practices, transparency, and effective public participation in the making of decisions concerning the environment, and the strengthening environmental standards, and their enforcement.

A clear understanding of the existing national and local instruments and mechanisms related to public participation is a critical first step to advance any sustainable development initiative. At the same time, stimulating and ensuring participation of local communities in different ways can yield positive impacts for sustainability and promote good governance.
