Re: Assistance for the OAS MESICIC (Follow up Mechanism to the Inter-American Convention against Corruption)

I write with reference to the above captioned matter.

With regard to your letter addressed to the Ministry of Legal Affairs on the 23rd July, 2008, the following is our response;

- 1. There is legislation in Grenada whereby a court may, on an application for judicial review, grant relief to any person whose interests were adversely affected by a decision made by a public body, public authority or a person acting in the exercise of a public duty. This piece of legislation is the West Indies Associated States Supreme Court Act, Cap 336 of the Revised Laws of Grenada (sections 24 and 25), and also by way of the Common law.
- 2. The Public Procurement and Contract Administration Act (No. 25 of 2007), Integrity in Public Life Act (No. 14 of 2007) and the Ombudsman Act (No. 24 of 2007) have all been enacted.
 - -The Public Procurement and Contract Administration Act came into force by Notice on the 1st of July, 2008.
 - -The Integrity in Public Life Act came into force on the 18th May, 2007.
 - -The Ombudsman Act came into force on the 21st of September, 2007.

3. The Prevention of Corruption Act (No. 15 of 2007) came into force on the 18th May, 2007.
