Re: Assistance for the OAS MESICIC (Follow up Mechanism to the Inter-American Convention against Corruption)

I write with reference to the above captioned matter.

With regard to your letter addressed to the Ministry of Legal Affairs on the 23rd July, 2008, the following is our response;

1. There is legislation in Grenada whereby a court may, on an application for judicial review, grant relief to any person whose interests were adversely affected by a decision made by a public body, public authority or a person acting in the exercise of a public duty. This piece of legislation is the *West Indies Associated States Supreme Court Act, Cap 336 of the Revised Laws of Grenada (sections 24 and 25)*, and also by way of the Common law.
2. The *Public Procurement and Contract Administration Act (No. 25 of 2007)*, *Integrity in Public Life Act (No. 14 of 2007)* and the *Ombudsman Act (No. 24 of 2007)* have all been enacted.


-The *Public Procurement and Contract Administration Act* came into force by Notice on the 1st of July, 2008.

-The *Integrity in Public Life Act* came into force on the 18th May, 2007.

-The *Ombudsman Act* came into force on the 21st of September, 2007.

3. The *Prevention of Corruption Act (No. 15 of 2007)* came into force on the 18th May, 2007.
