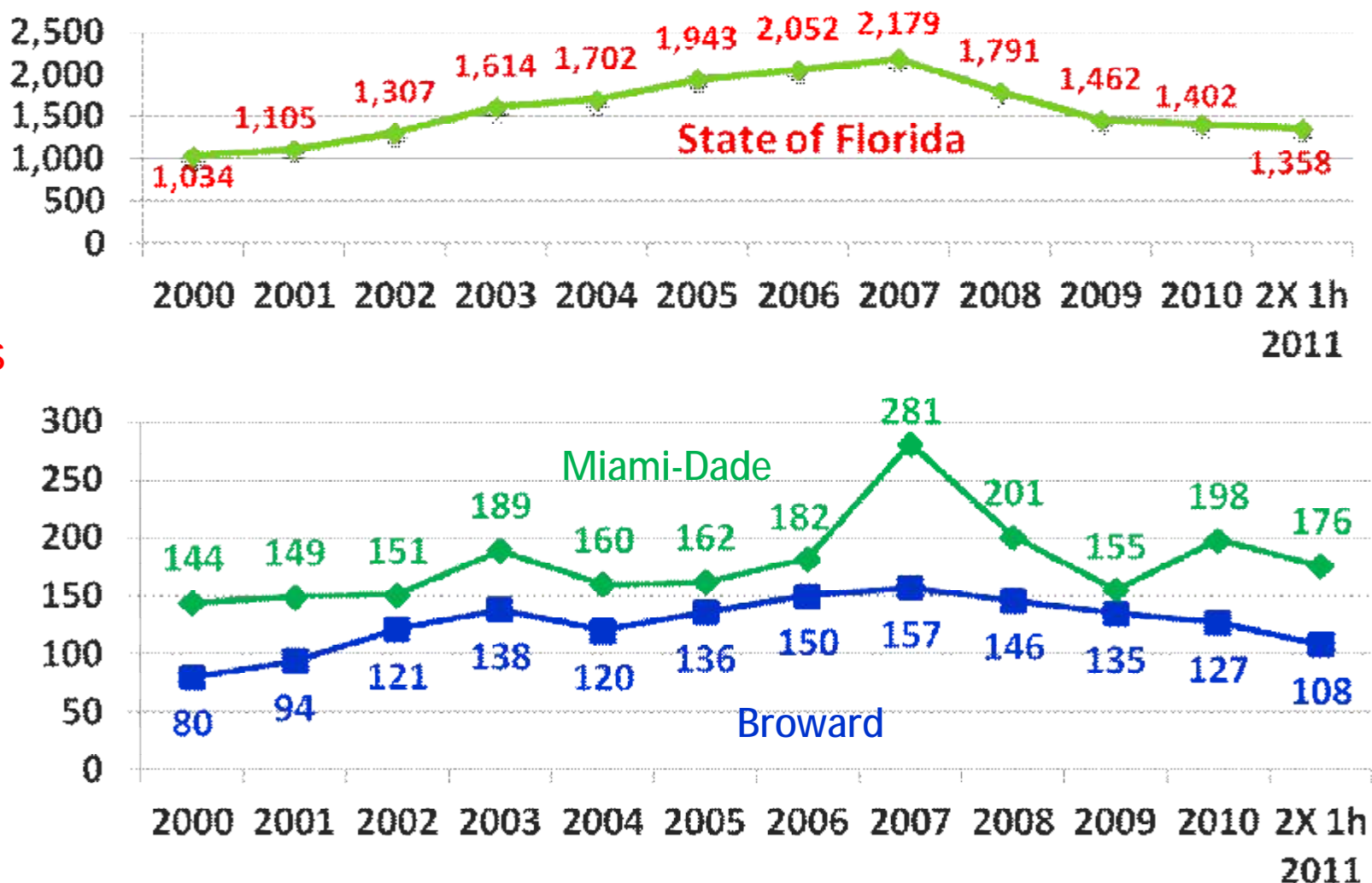
National CEWG Drug Trends Update June 2012

- Cocaine declines reported across all 21 sites
- Heroin maintains presence,
 - Expands to new areas including small towns
 - Fueled by young adult Rx opioid abusers
- Prescription opioid nonmedical use escalates
- Emerging synthetic drug consequences most pronounced in the Central US and Florida
- Marijuana is ubiquitous
- Methamphetamine rising in the West again



Number of Cocaine Reports Detected Among Decedents in Florida: 2000 - 2011

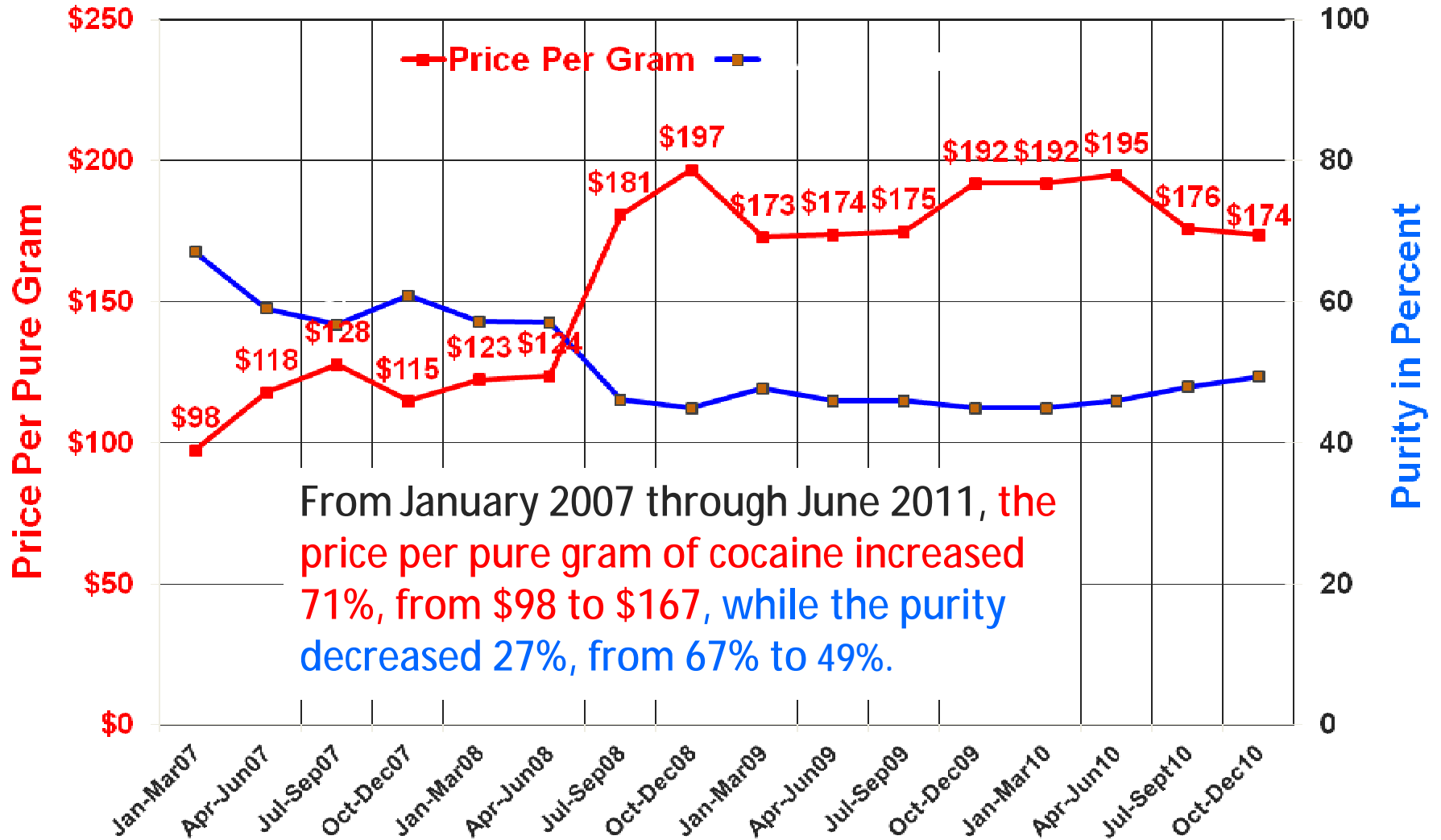
NUMBER of COCAINE OCCURRENCES Including "Present" & "Cause of Death"

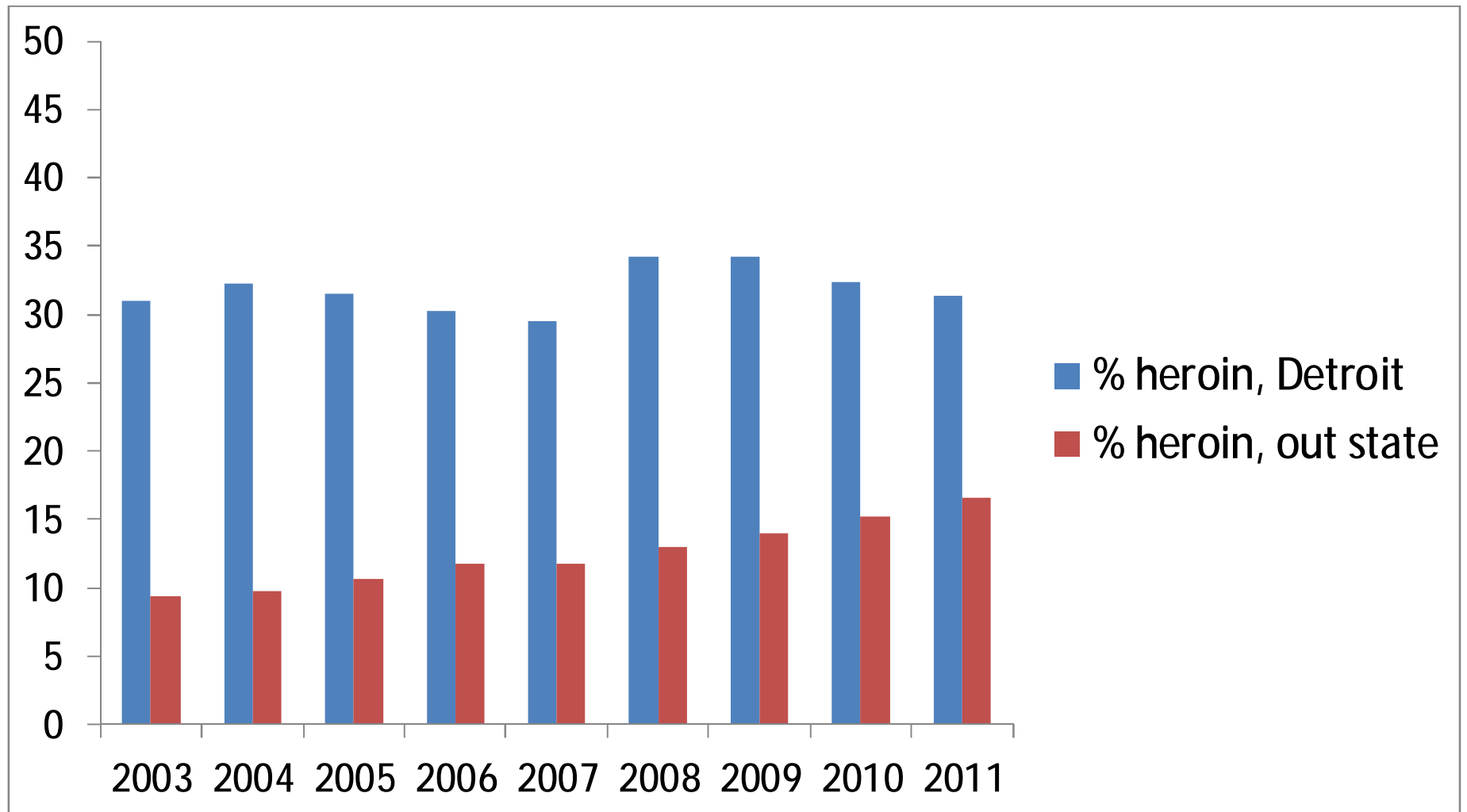


All Cocaine Purchases Domestic STRIDE Data January 2007 – June 2011



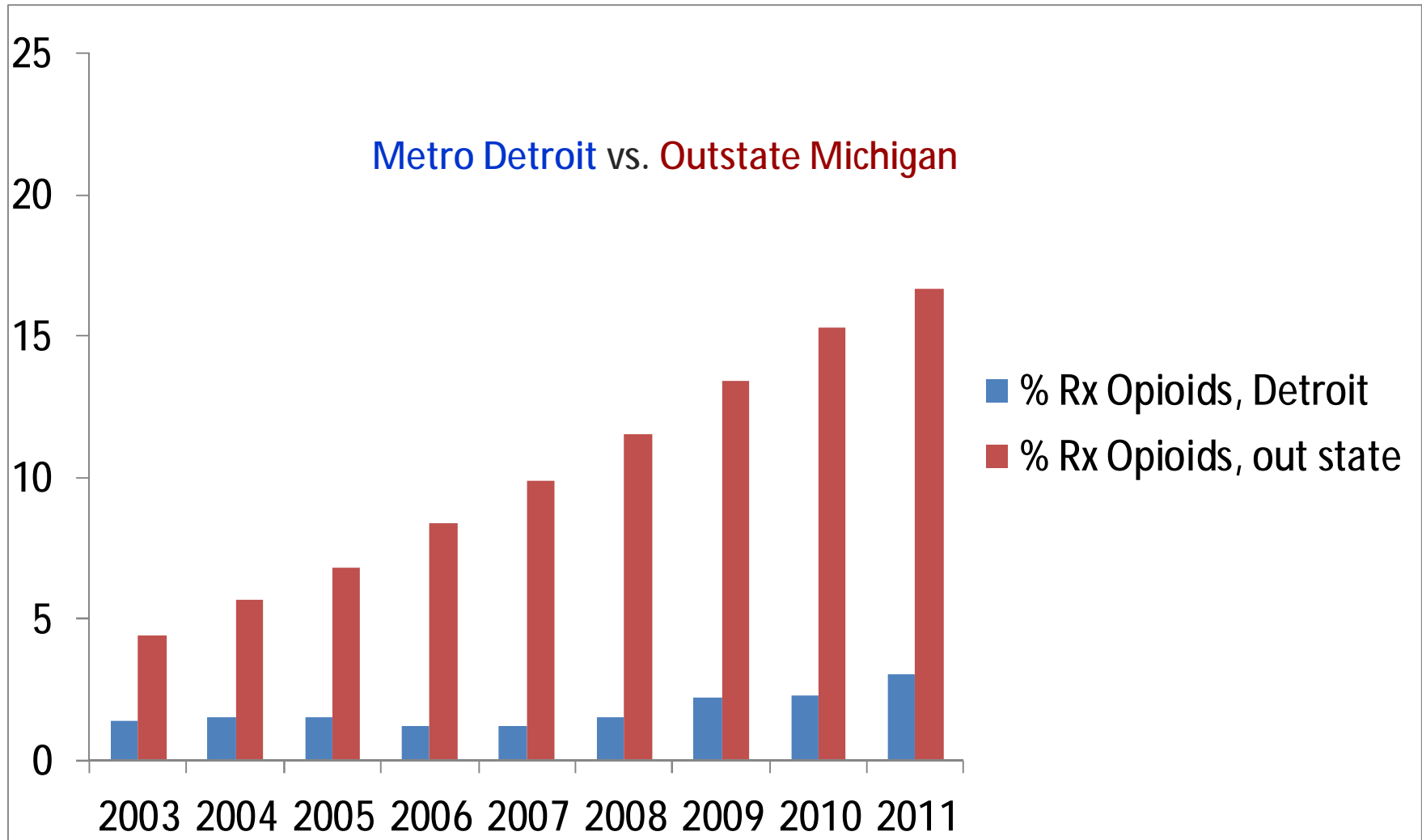
Percentage of publicly-funded substance abuse treatment admissions for heroin by location and year

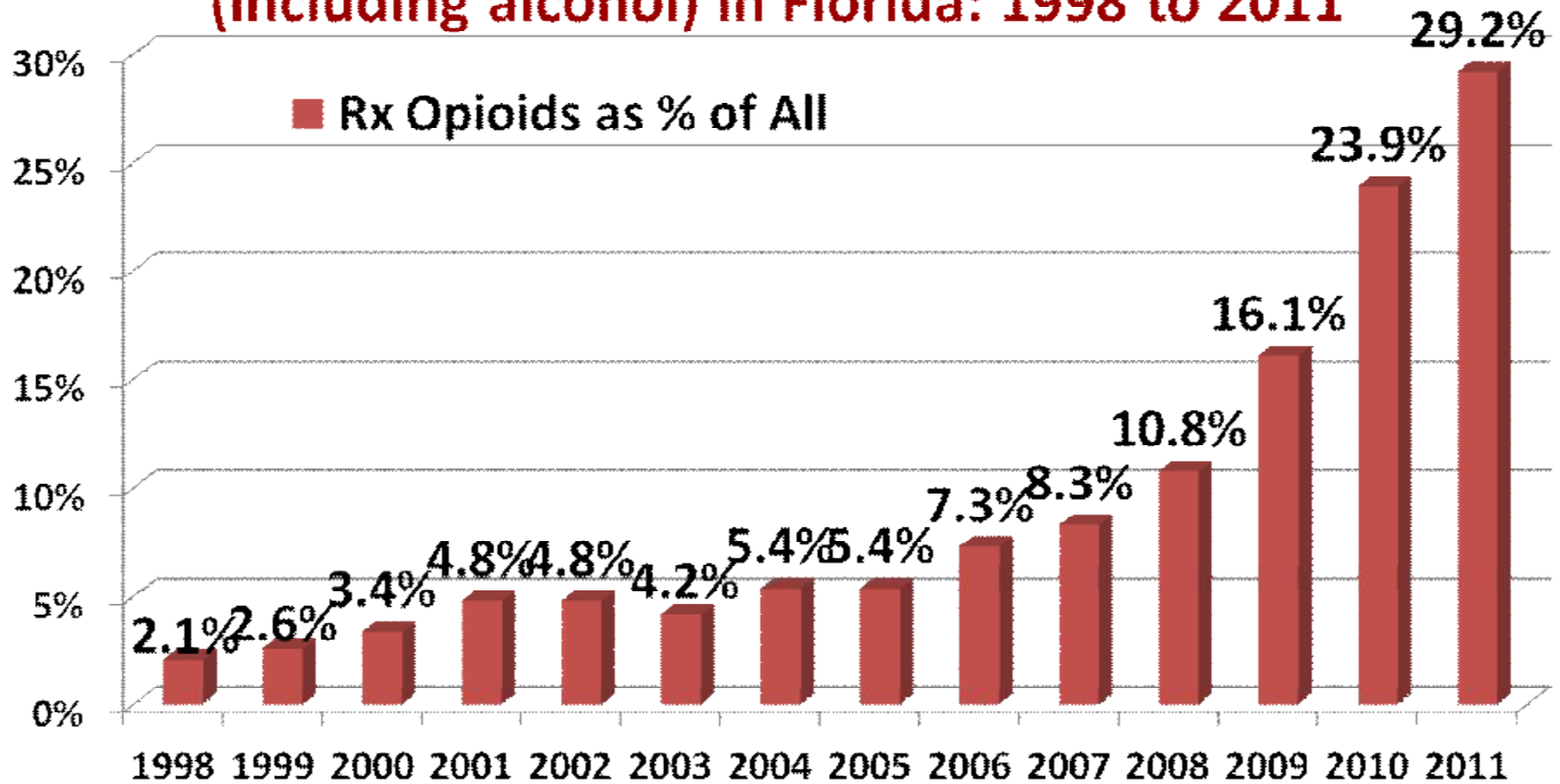

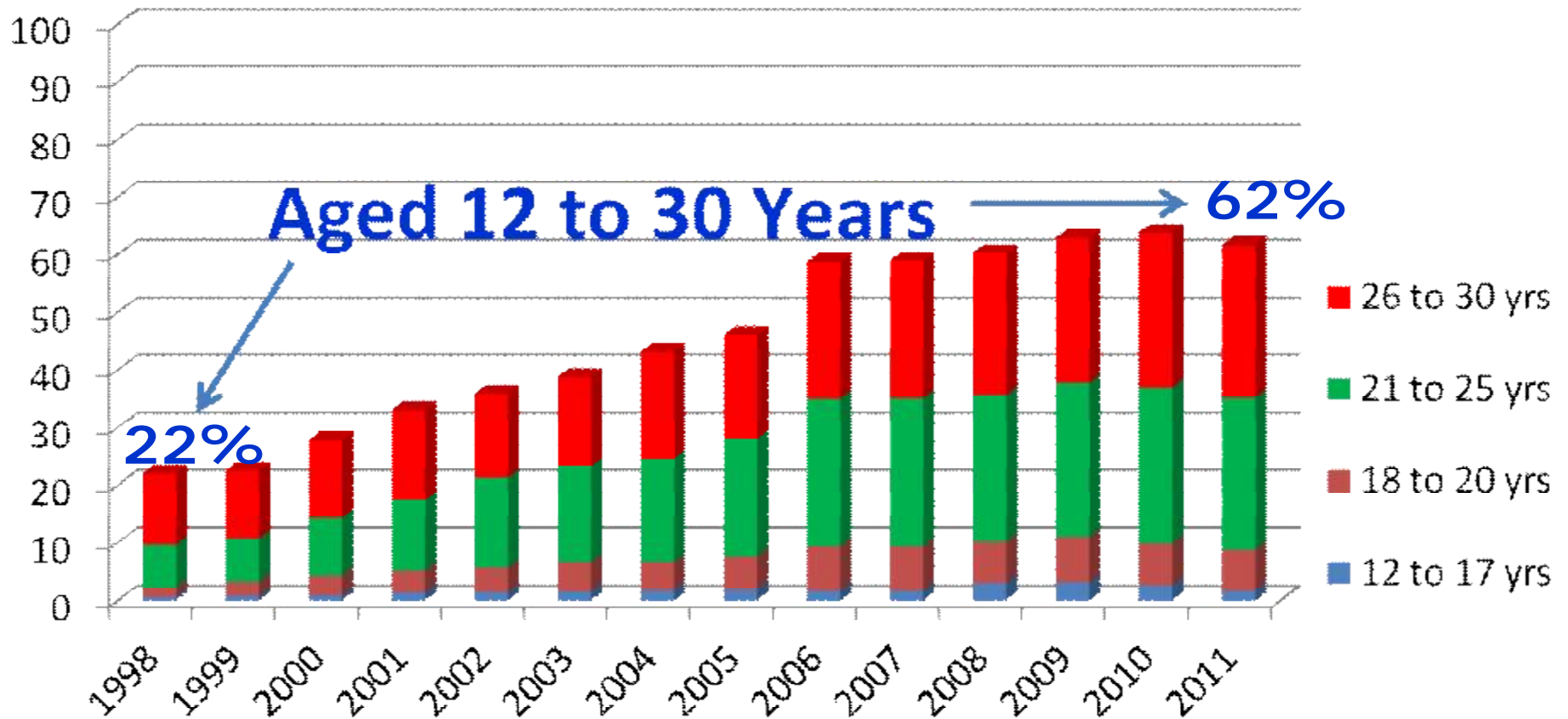

Percent of Primary Addiction Treatment Admissions for Rx Opioids among all substances (including alcohol) in Florida: 1998 to 2011

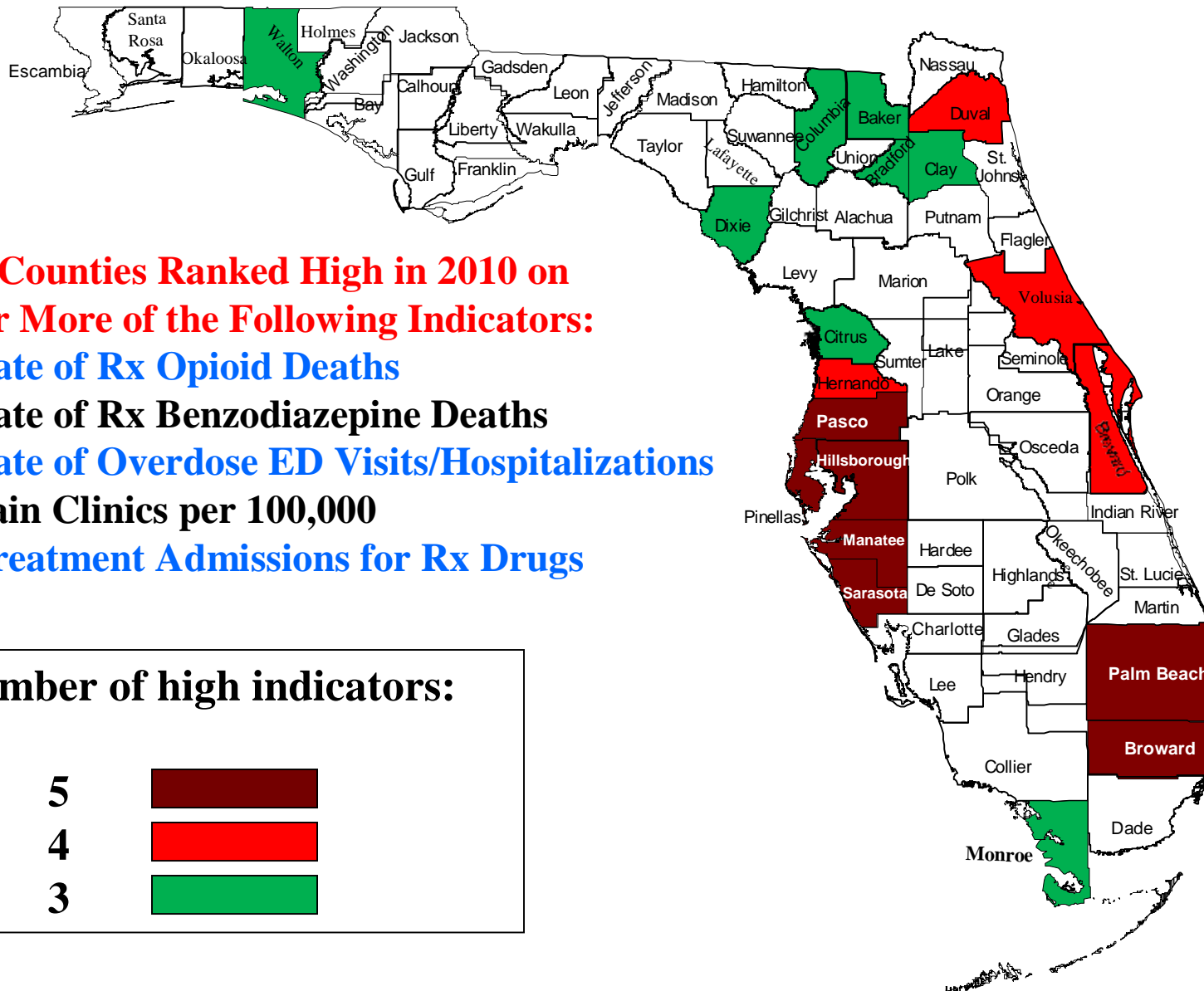

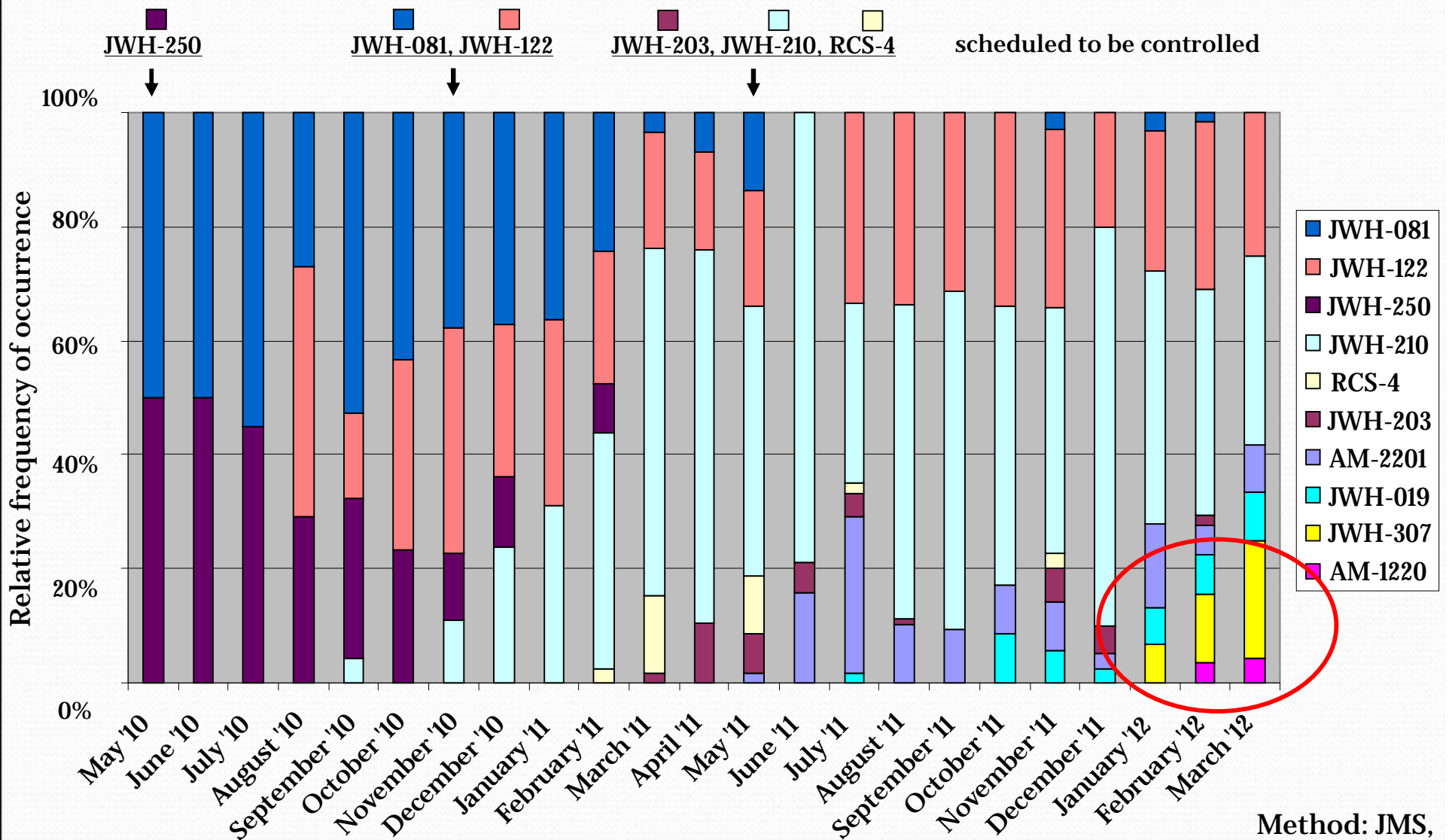

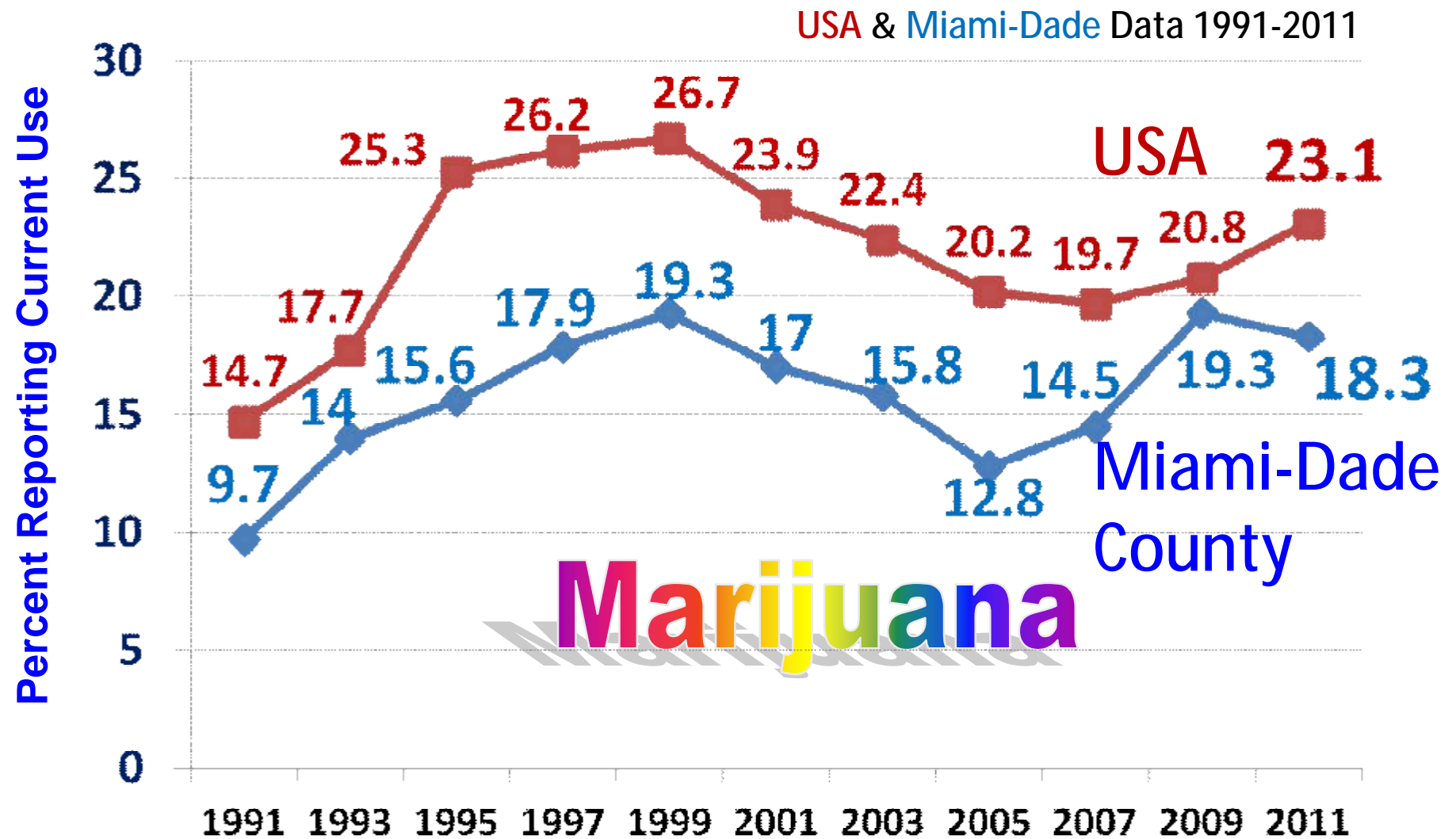

Percent of High School Students Reporting Any Past 30-Day Marijuana Use USA & Miami-Dade County: 1991-2011



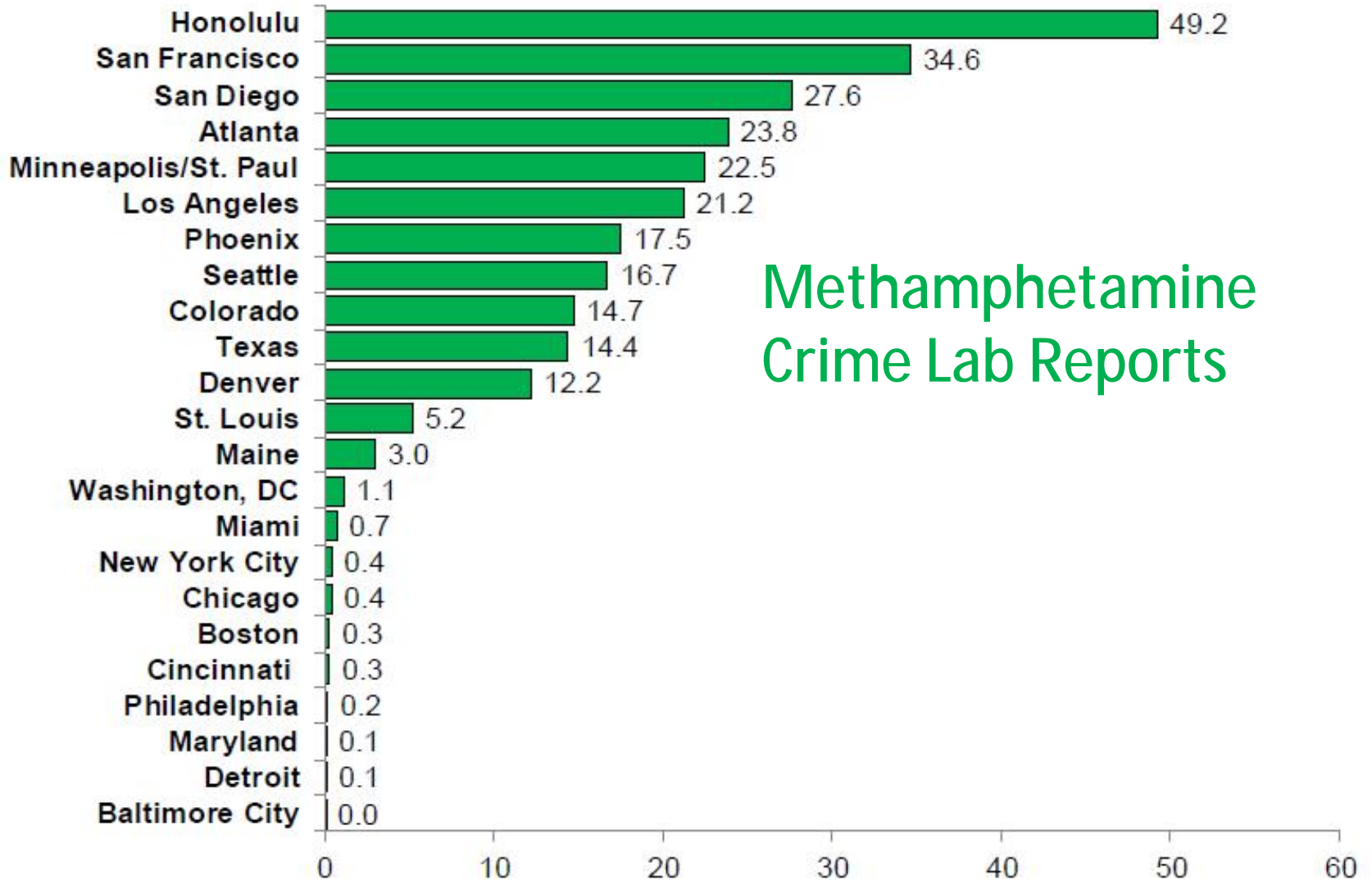

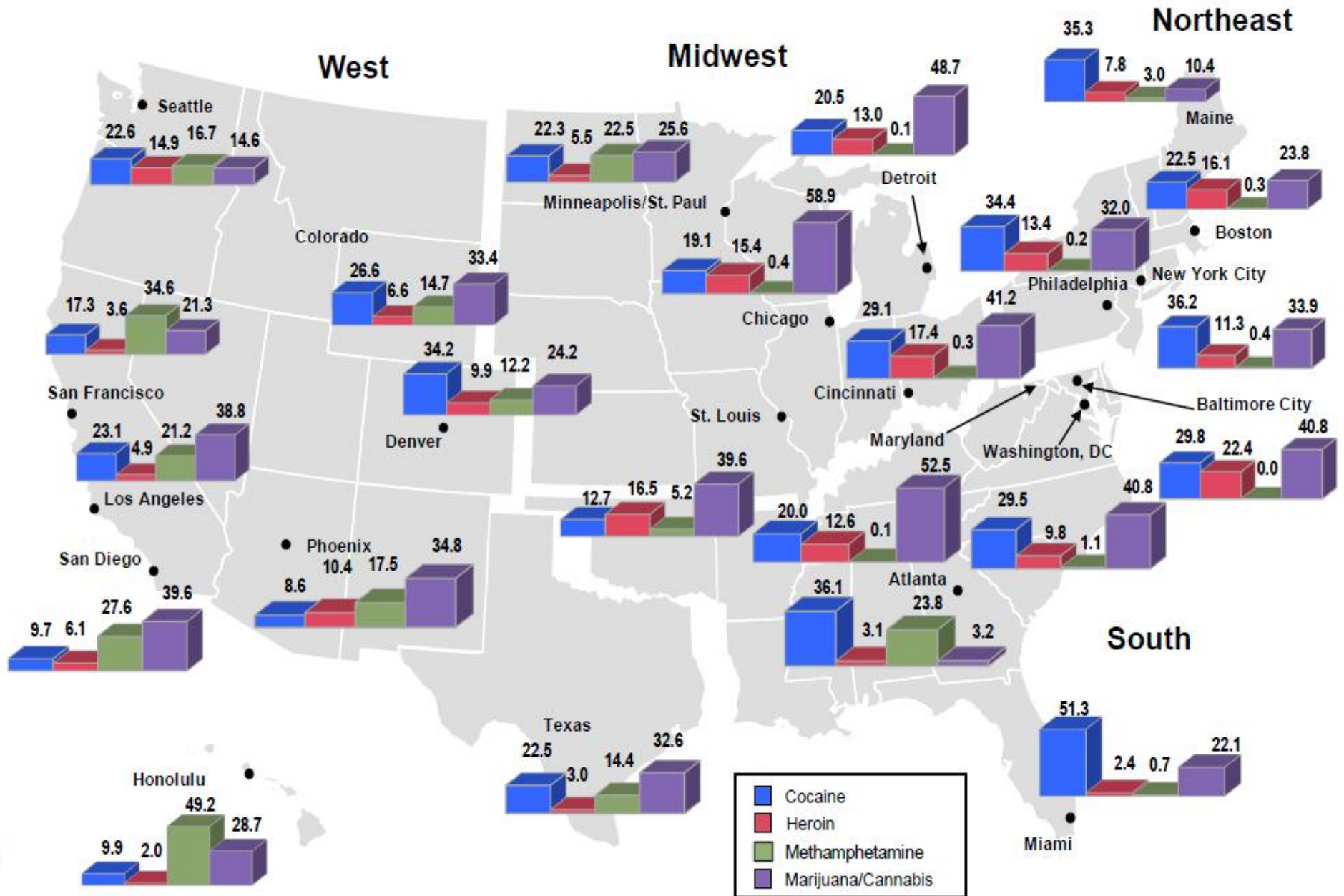
Figure 11. Methamphetamine Items Seized and Identified in Forensic Laboratories, as a Percentage of Total NFLIS Drug Items, 23 CEWG Areas: 1H 2011¹
