Comparison of Tobacco Use (GYTS) results



Summary

- —St. Lucia recorded the highest Alcohol use of the age group studied.
- St. Lucia recorded the second highest marijuana use of the same age group.
- According to the students St. Lucia is the second easiest country to access marijuana.
- Tobacco is also used throughout the region, but to a lesser extent than alcohol and even marijuana. There is a lot of experimentation with cigarettes, but current use rates are very low
- past year marijuana prevalence overtook cigarette prevalence in st.lucia 2011
