# Developing a comprehensive approach to Demand Reduction- Laying the foundation





1994 – Barbados Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States

 Barbados Plan of Action -1996 contained a Demand Reduction Section that encouraged a regional approach, with support from Hemispheric and International organisations



CARICOM – Increased its focus on Demand Reduction

- 2002-2003 Began discussions on the development of a Regional Demand Reduction Strategy
- 2003 Added a position which incorporated this area as a primary responsibility





CICAD – Assisted with the development of National Drug Commissions and National Plans

- Most Commissions in the Region are Demand Reduction focused
- Began discussion on an On-Line Training programme with UWI



EU – Granted funding through 9<sup>th</sup> European Development Fund (9<sup>th</sup> EDF)

# Consolidating the gains - PROCCER



Introduced to Caribbean Member States in 2011

First PROCCER initiative to take a regional approach to ensure harmonization of human resources throughout the region

Ensured engagement at the Political, Policy and Operational level

 CARICOM, National Drug Commissions, Treatment Providers – Government and Civil Society, Tertiary and Other Educational institutions – University of the West Indies and St. George's University

Agreement on the formation of an Advisory Council to guide the implementation of the project

Assessments have been undertaken

Exams developed, administered and marked by UWI, Mona

Certificates issued by UWI and CICAD

Over four hundred persons (400) trained between Prevention and Treatment





Content developed and reviewed 2014

Pilot training Jamaican and Trinidad and Tobago – January and September 2015 respectively – Seventy Four (74) persons trained

Sensitisation to the Executive of the Caribbean Association of Psychologist

Training conducted at the *International Society of Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Professionals* 2015 and 2017 – A total of Sixty Three (63) persons trained – 2015 – Reps of Fourteen (14) Countries; 2017 – Reps Nine (9) Caribbean states and the CARICOM Secretariat and Six (6) other countries.

Sensitisation on the content delivered to School Social Workers of the Ministry of Education, and workers in Children's homes and Juvenile detention facilities 2015-2016 – A total of Sixty Five (65) persons sensitized

Additional Modules developed on – Trauma and trauma involved care, Gangs and Marijuana (To be reviewed and finalised)

Presentation to the Demand Reduction Expert Group and the Regional Workshop on Drug Information Networks – 2017

Information shared at DTC Workshop September 2017

UWI developed and administered an exam for the programme
