## Group of Experts on Chemical Substances and Pharmaceutical Products

Hemispheric-level forum that brings together representatives of member states linked to the control of chemical precursors that are - or may be - used in the manufacture of illicit drugs.



#### **Model Regulations**

- Reference tool for OAS member states.
- It includes general aspects on the problem of chemical precursor control.
- Response to the dynamic nature of illicit drug manufacture.

#### Latest update of the Model Regulations

2019

- Review and update of the Model Regulations by the Group of Experts.
- Participation of 36 experts from 10 member states, UNODC and COPOLAD.





#### **Model Regulations 2019**

The document has 45 articles, divided into 16 parts

Part I. Purpose and Scope of Application

**Part II. Definitions** 

**Part III. Tables of Chemical Substances** 

Part IV. Substances under Surveillance

**Part V. Mixtures** 

**Part VI. Control Measures** 

Part VII. Import, Export Transit and Transshipment Requirements

Part X. Offences

**Part XI. Investigation and Proof of Offences** 

Part XII. Extradition and Mutual Legal Assistance

Part XV. Competent Authorities for International Cooperation

Part XVI. Cooperation with Operators and with the Private Sector



- The new version includes the illicit production of precursors from noncontrolled chemical substances and the emerging problem of the socalled "designer" precursors.
- Automatic updating of chemical substances included in the annexes as Tables I and II of the 1988 United Nations Convention are modified.
- Table III of the Model Regulations must contain at least the substances included in INCB's special surveillance list.







- Inclusion of the concepts of operator and intermediary.
- Expansion of the term manufacturing to also include obtaining chemical substances that could be used in the illicit manufacture of drugs.
- Redefinition of chemical substance in order to consider "design" precursors and non-controlled chemical substances used to obtain precursors.
- Inclusion of the term traffic.
- Added the definition of irregular movement or suspicious transactions.



- Incentive for international cooperation to establish control parameters for new trends.
- New requirement for the granting of authorizations.
- Inspections of non-authorized operators and operators handling of noncontrolled chemical substances.
- Action protocol for possible crimes.
- Designation of sensitive areas or routes within the national territory.



- Strengthening of customs' capacities.
- Pre-notification of foreign trade linked to the substances included in Tables II and III.
- Expansion of actions considered a crime.
- Incorporation of new investigative tools.
- Obligation to develop a protocol for the process of final disposal of seized or confiscated chemical substances.
- **Expansion** of **cooperation with the private sector** beyond the chemical industry.

**Expedited updating of control lists** 

Use of online platforms for the exchange of information

Implementation of evidence-based control policies

Increase of international cooperation

Risk profiling

Strengthening the control of electronic commerce



#### **Model Regulations 2019 - Recommendations**

Protection of officials who report or investigate

New signs of illicit traffic

Consider individual tariff code designation

The use of adulterants as an aggravating factor

Information and evidence processing

Updating the text of the recommendations
