Update Regarding COVID-19 Pandemic's Impact on ITEN's Activities!

Dear ITEN Community:

We hope this note finds you and your families safe and healthy. Circumstances are changing constantly, but we remain dedicated to our teachers and education professionals in Latin America & the Caribbean.

As you are all aware, the COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted all aspects of life as we know it. ITEN in particular has been impacted by having to postpone our Annual Seminar. Originally planned for August 24-27, we intend to reschedule the ITEN Annual Seminar for late 2020 or early 2021, depending on the circumstances. We will keep you posted as the new developments unravel.

Regarding grants, ITEN will not be accepting new proposals for Cooperation Exchanges in 2020 until we have received indication that international travel can be advised, but will be anticipating Seed Grant awards to provide additional financial support during this crisis. Additionally, the ITEN Team is working diligently to identify alternative solutions to support the ITEN community during these times of crisis, and will adjust our mechanisms accordingly. Project Team meetings are underway, and ITEN is currently reviewing your teams' submitted Vision and Goals statements!

Please note that while the Annual Seminar is being postponed, ITEN remains committed to offering 2020 Project Team cycle participants the opportunity to attend the Seminar when it is rescheduled.



On February 26, 2020, six members from ITEN's 2019 Project Teams traveled from the Dominican Republic, Jamaica, and Washington, D.C. to participate in a Cooperation Exchange at Stanford University in Stanford, California. The event consisted of two days of discussions and learning experiences from some of the top research professionals in teacher education, assessments, language acquisition and understanding, and education policy, all related to topics within STEM. The Cooperation Exchange hosts, Greses Pérez Jhönk and Daniel Alcazar Roman, organized six, in depth collegial conversation sessions, as well as visits to the Stanford Graduate School of Education Makery (a space for hands-on learning), local middle school science classes, and attendance to the Education Research to Practice Seminar. The density of knowledge, wisdom, and actionable best-practices that resulted from these two action-packed days is comparable to a weeklong seminar. Leaders in Times of Crisis

In the 2019-2020 year, ITEN's Teacher Fellows have been focusing on their own instructional practice by participating in an analysis of learning sequences that incorporate evidence-based, gender-equitable practices for teaching STEM. Moving into the 2020-2021 year, Teacher Fellows will begin working on their leadership plans to expand their impact beyond their own classrooms and schools.

However, educators within ITEN across the region are already taking significant leadership to respond to the educational impact of COVID-19. ITEN partners <u>Sandra Guerrero</u> (Dominican Republic), <u>Bhagya Malladi and Conroy Hall</u> (Jamaica) have held impromptu training sessions for 140+ science teachers.

Early childhood teachers have additional struggles, and many teachers are turning to WhatsApp groups to maintain contact with the parents of young children. The platform has led to multiple opportunities for sharing multimedia documentation of student engagement. ITEN Teacher Fellow Shaffina Ahamad-Hamid (Trinidad) shares how she is using WhatsApp to maintain some semblance of normalcy for her students.
