Focused on continuing education in the face of the pandemic, the Ministry of Education of the Dominican Republic developed an emergency action plan to prepare for and continue the educational process in the event of social isolation.

In consultation with leaders, the guide "Learning from Home" was created - 30 simple activities that respond to the fundamental competences of the educational curriculum and that can be carried out from home with the facilitation of families and the active participation of children.
