As we approach the close of this year's Project Team cycle, the past few months have seen an explosion of activity.

Last week, partners from **Ecuador** and **Peru** began "<u>Strengthening STEM Pedagogical Performance</u>", a five-session virtual professional development for primary school teachers. This week, partners from **Argentina**, the **Dominican Republic**, and **Uruguay** begin their multi-week online course "<u>STEAM Focus: Teaching and Learning About and For Real-Life Situations</u>". Meanwhile, 2019 Seed Grant recipients from **Jamaica** have been deploying an "<u>Integrated STEAM Seminar</u>" with an emphasis on teaching computational thinking in early childhood, and partners from **Colombia**, **Costa Rica**, **Honduras**, and the **USA** are showcasing their hands-on, low-





Learning Mathematics in the 21st Century: Adding Technology to the Equation

Published by the Inter-American Development Bank, this book sheds light on how governments can take better advantage of the potential of technology to improve student learning, specifically, on mathematics. The first part presents a thorough diagnosis of the main challenges to mathematics learning in the region. The second part describes a range of technological models and assesses their capacity to tackle these challenges and produce improvements in learning. By combining theoretical and empirical approaches, reviewing innovative initiatives, and drawing lessons from psychology, education, and economics, the book aims to become a reference for policymakers who want to make the promise of technology in education a reality for all students in the region.




Learning for Students and Schools
