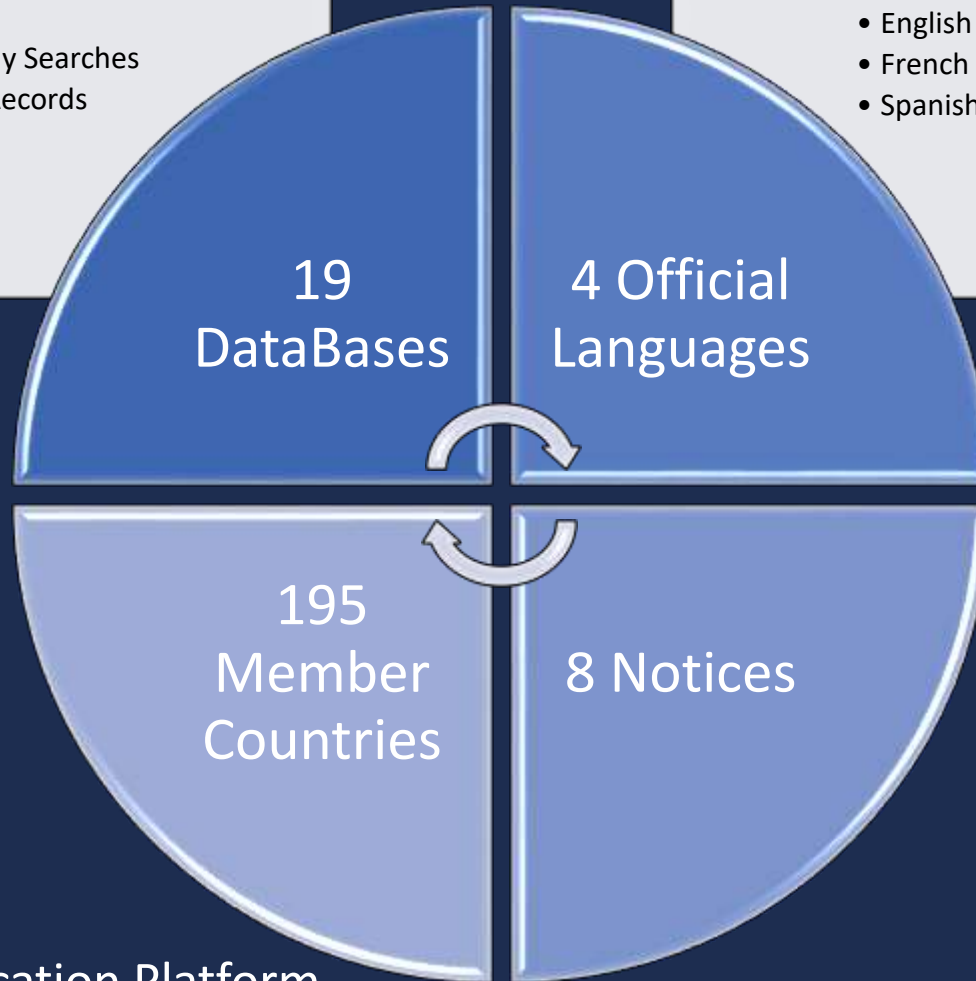

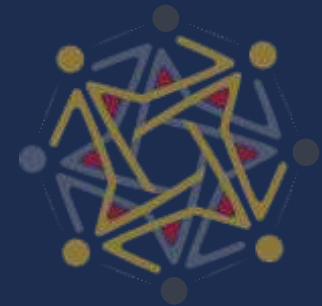

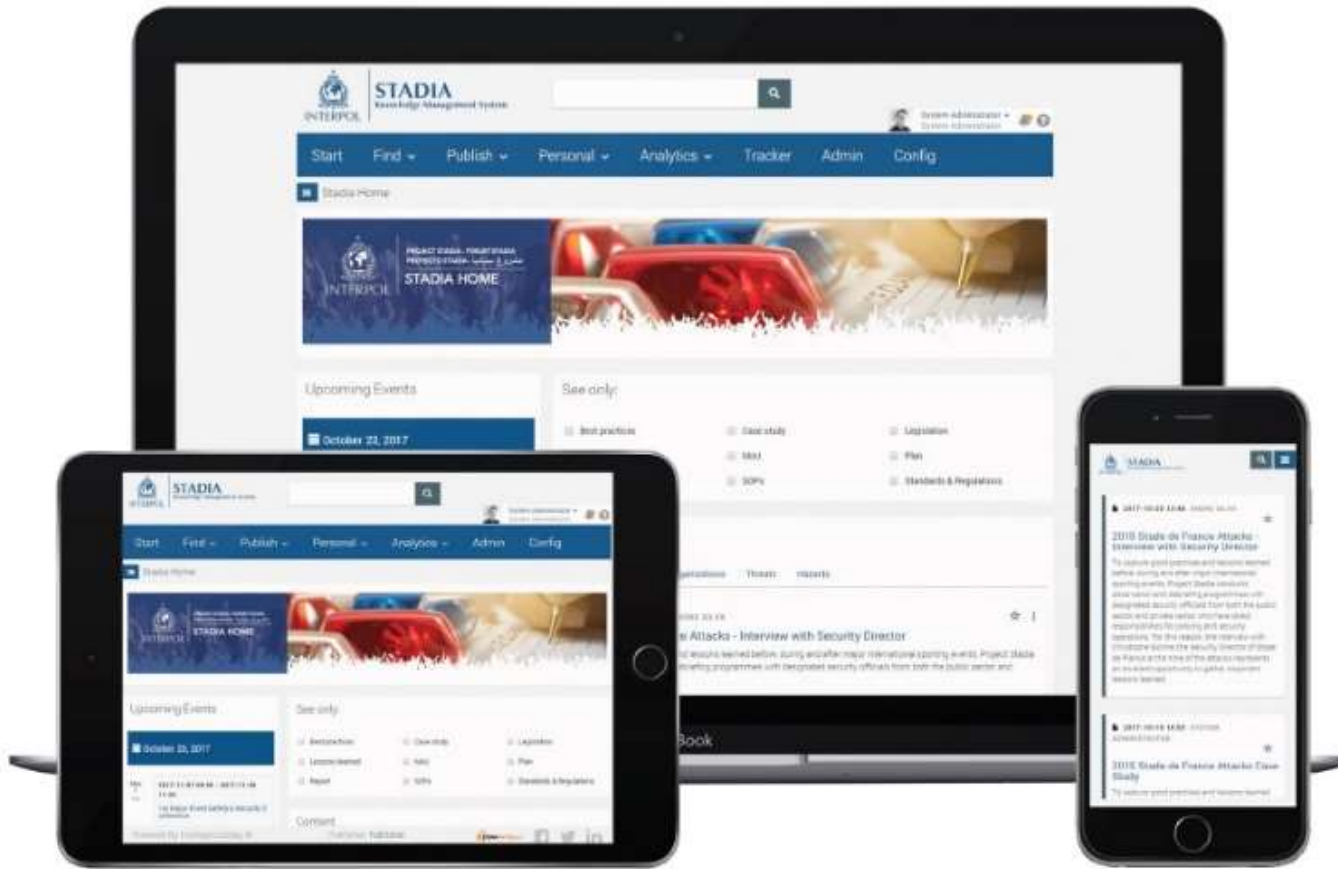

What Is Police Cooperation?

Interaction of police officers and/or police organisations, either on a day-to-day basis in operational cases (mainly but not only criminal) or within other different types of arrangements (e.g. training, exchange of information, technical support, etc.) aiming to tackle criminal activity and/or to respond to events to improve safety and security of the populations on a general perspective.

Factors that can affect IPC

- Legal framework
- Managerial Regime and Leadership
- Technological and HR
- Political Regime
- Cultural framework

What is an IPCC?



A temporary (ad-hoc) established administrative body to ensure law and order during the tournament, as well as a physical network among the law enforcement agencies of the states participating in the tournament (but not limited) and international organisations, in an operational concept to assure a pleasant, joyful and a safe and secure event. It serves as a hub for the International Police Cooperation

- IPCC Brazil World CUP 2014
 - 37 Countries
 - 205 police officers from countries (allowed :3 per fixed team +4 per mobile team)
 - 106 Brazilian Police Officers
- IPCC Brazil Olympics 2016
 - 55 Countries
 - 250 police Officers from countries
 - 220 Brazilian Police Officers
- IPCC Korea Winter Olympics 2018
 - 16 Officers from 15 different countries and Interpol
 - 16 Korean police Officers
- IPCC Russia World CUP 2018
 - 32 Countries
 - 153 Police officers from countries (the majority of the countries have been represented with 2 fixed +3 mobile)
- IPCC Qatar World CUP 2022
 - 29Countries
 - 170 Police officers from countries more INTERPOL and Europol (figures TBC)

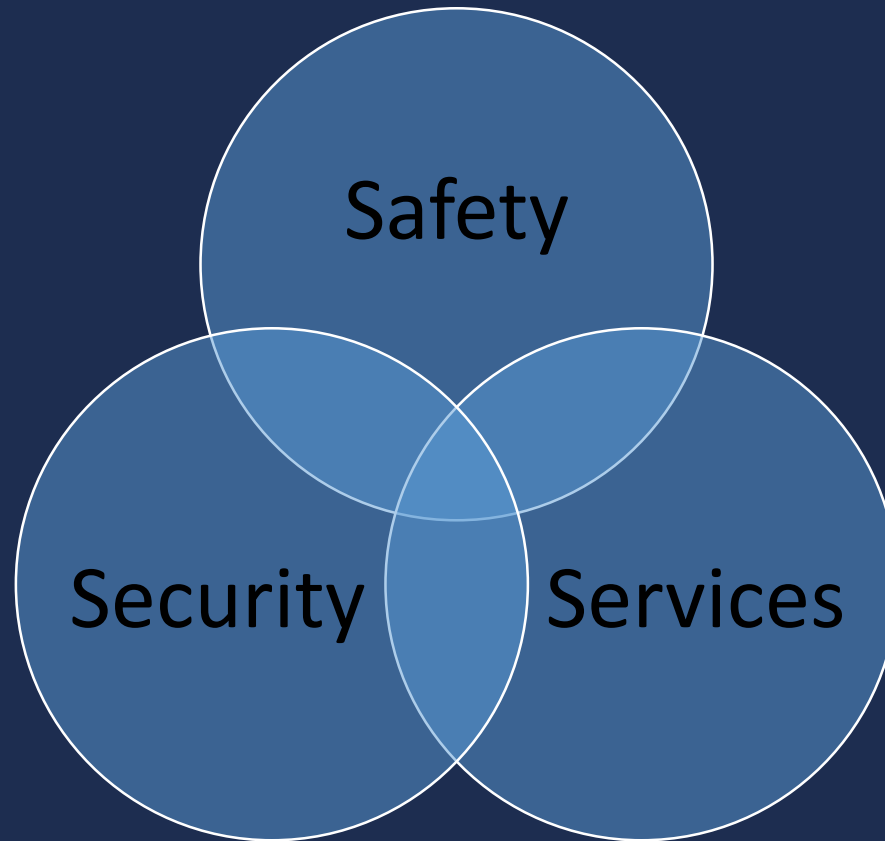

- Diego Chacón was arrested by the Interpol in Doha, Qatar, on Thursday
- The 42-year-old attorney was wanted for a November 19 robbery in San Salvador de Jujuy, Argentina, that left a warehouse worker dead and another wounded
- One of the workers was shot in the head and died at a hospital
- Authorities raided Chacón's home November 29 and discovered while searching through his girlfriend's phone that he was in Qatar to watch the World Cup
- The wanted lawyer also posted extensively about his trip on social media

Greenpeace protest “foiled at the last minute” in Lisbon

After three days hiding in a cement tube at Lisbon’s Luz Stadium, Greenpeace activists had planned to leap out during the Champions League game last Saturday and hang a protest banner embarrassing the event’s Russian co-sponsor, fuel giant Gazprom. But at the 11th hour, the environmentalists were spotted by police snipers on the stadium roof and their elaborate plan was foiled. A Spanish colleague not involved in the ruse said: “The objective was to hang a banner protesting against Gazprom’s activity in the Arctic”. Protesters knew Gazprom bosses were at the game and wanted to get maximum publicity, Luís Ferreirim told
