
# **PROMOTING COHESION**



The visitor must be informed of local rules and regulations in order to avoid committing criminal behavior or misconduct





## KEY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ENHANCING THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF THE TOURISM INDUSTRY

Encouraging hotels to adopt practices that will reduce guest victimization.

- . Electronic room locks
- . Safety deposit boxes,
- . Surveillance cameras
- . Security officers
- . Safety tips on website or in-house cable TV channel.

#### **POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS**

Signing of a Charter between hotel association and the police


- Pledging to tighten security in their premises and to update staff training
- Require the hotels to each submit a detailed plan to the police at the start of each year, describing how they intend to combat and prevent crime in their respective premises

Assist hotels in their regular evaluation of their security systems using a comprehensive audit checklist
