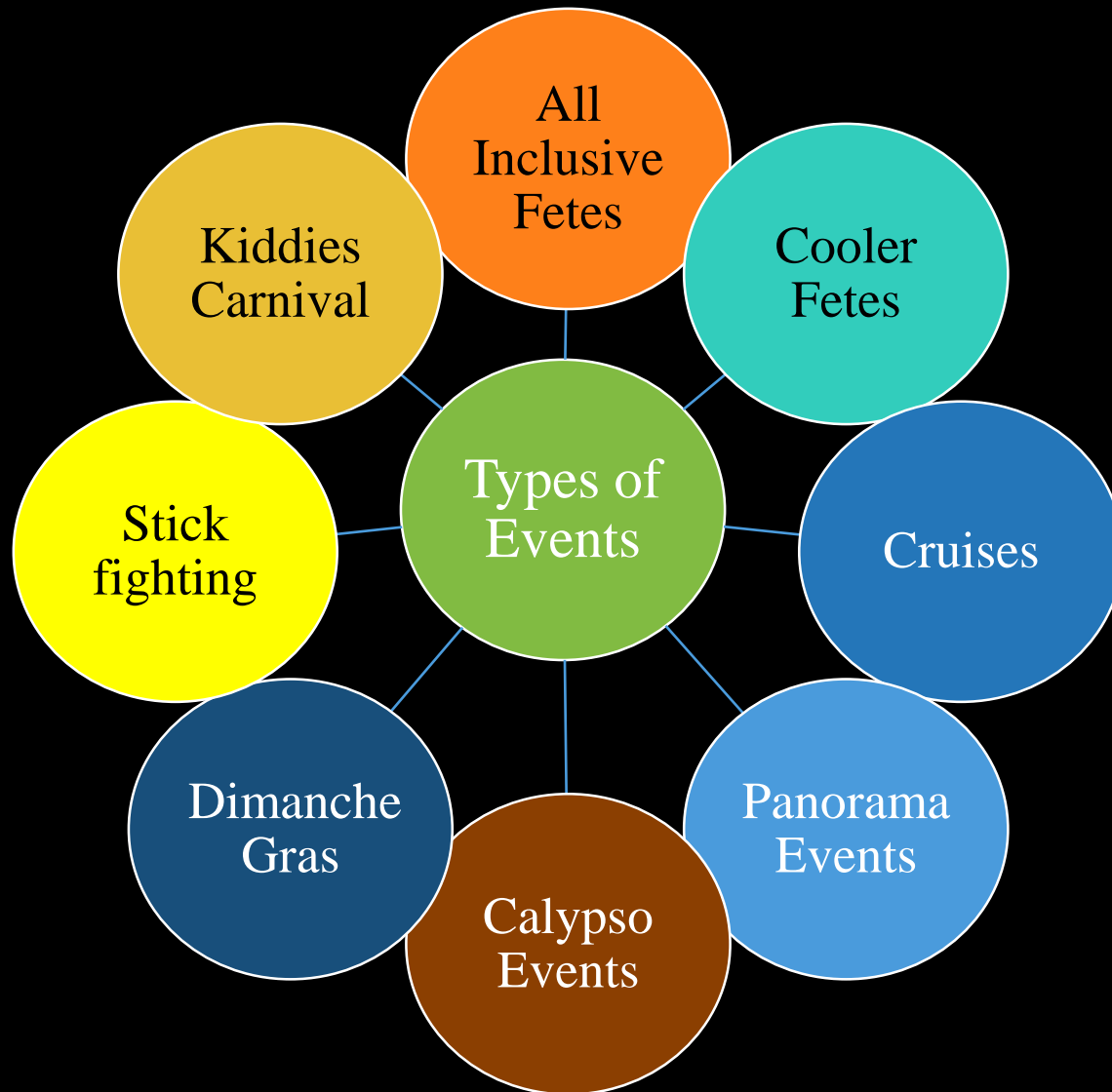

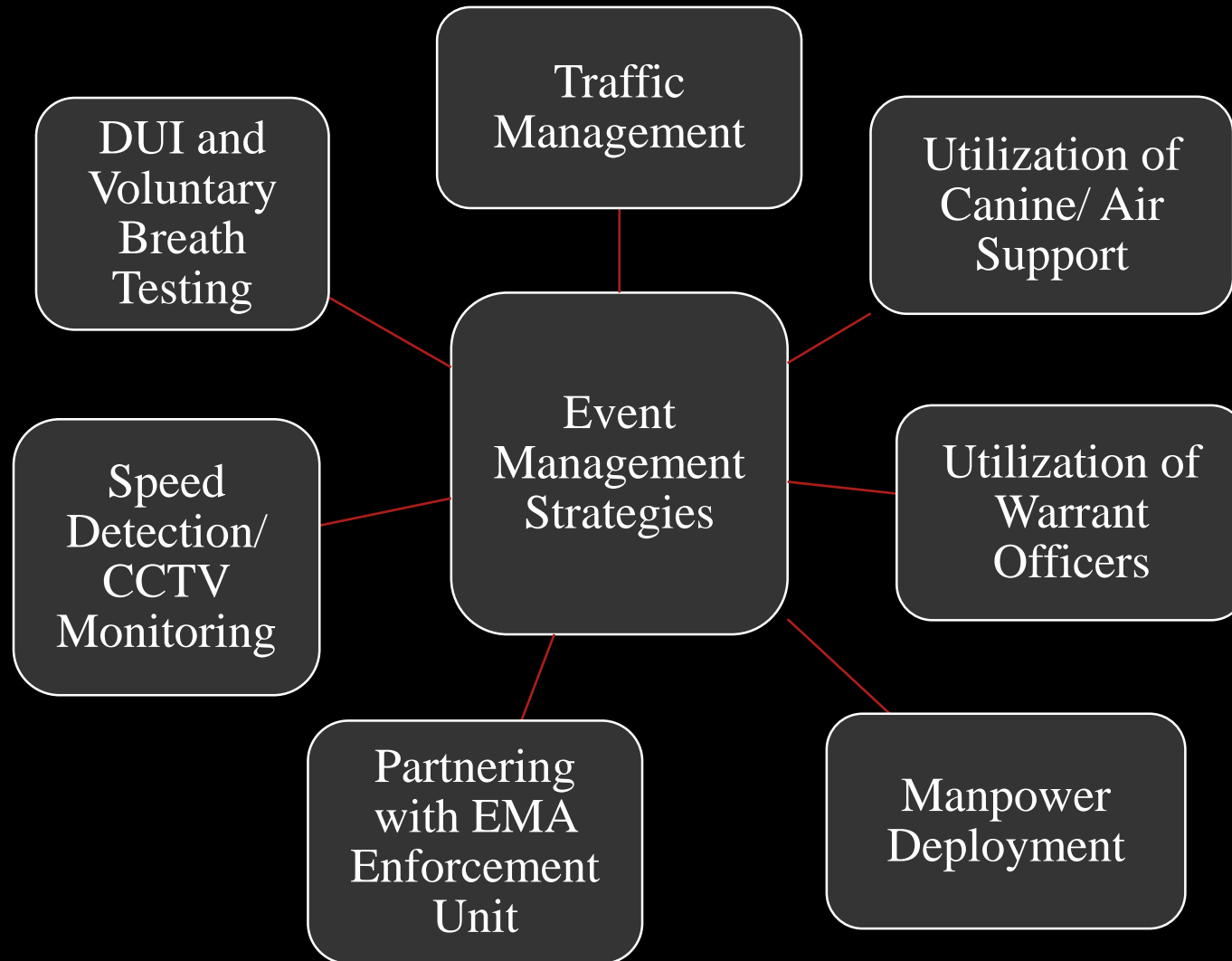

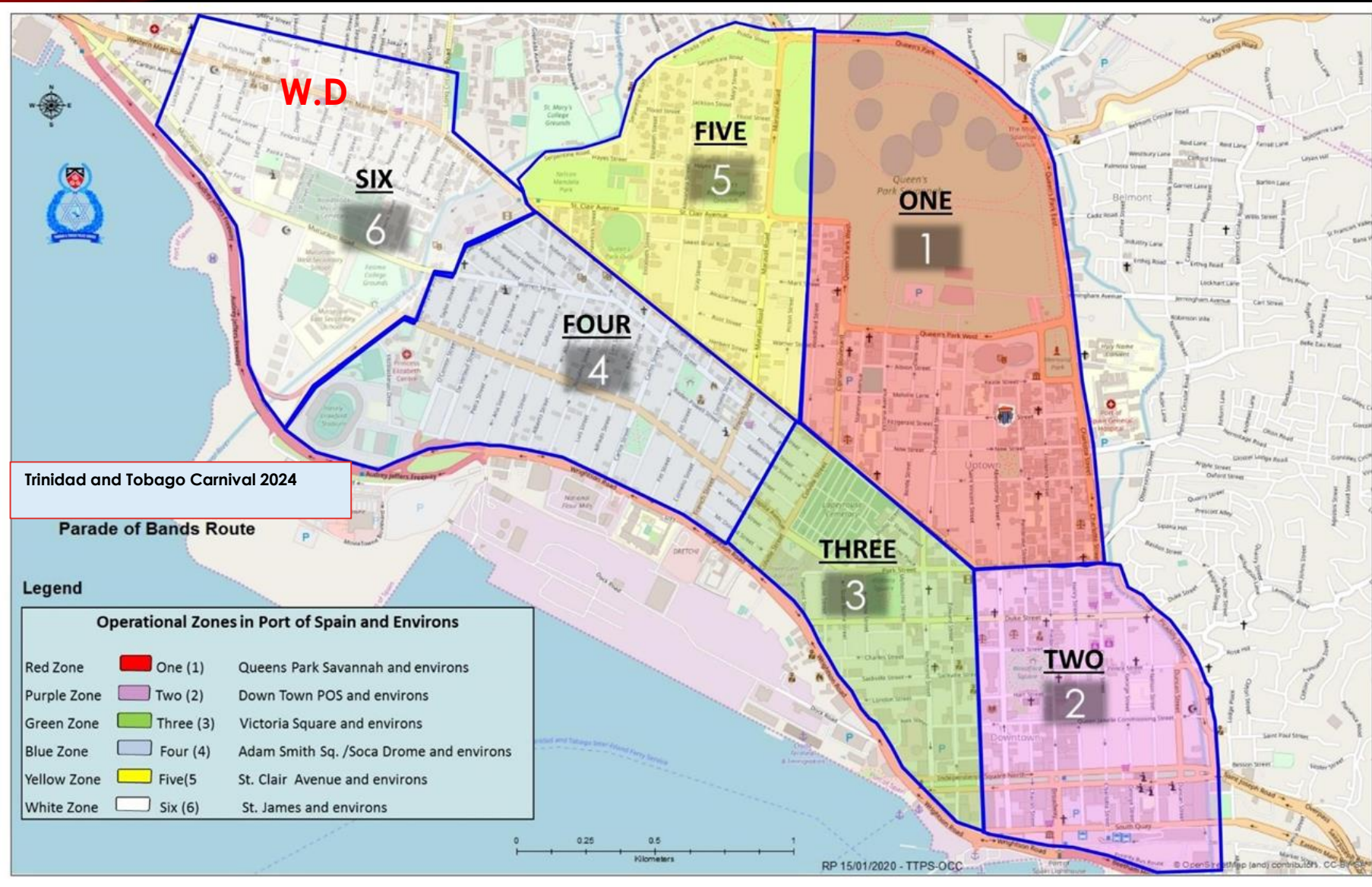

West: From Audrey Jeffers Highway along Maraval Parkway, Ariapita Avenue, Belle Smythe Street, Warren Street, Damien Street to Roxy Round-a-bout.
- **Zone 5:** North: From Serpentine Road along Prada Street, Circular Road to Zoo Road. East: From Tragarete Road along Woodford Street, along an imaginary line through the Queens Park Savannah to Zoo Road. South: From Woodford Street along Tragarete Road to Roxy Round-a-bout. West: From Roxy Round-a-bout along Serpentine Road to Prada Street

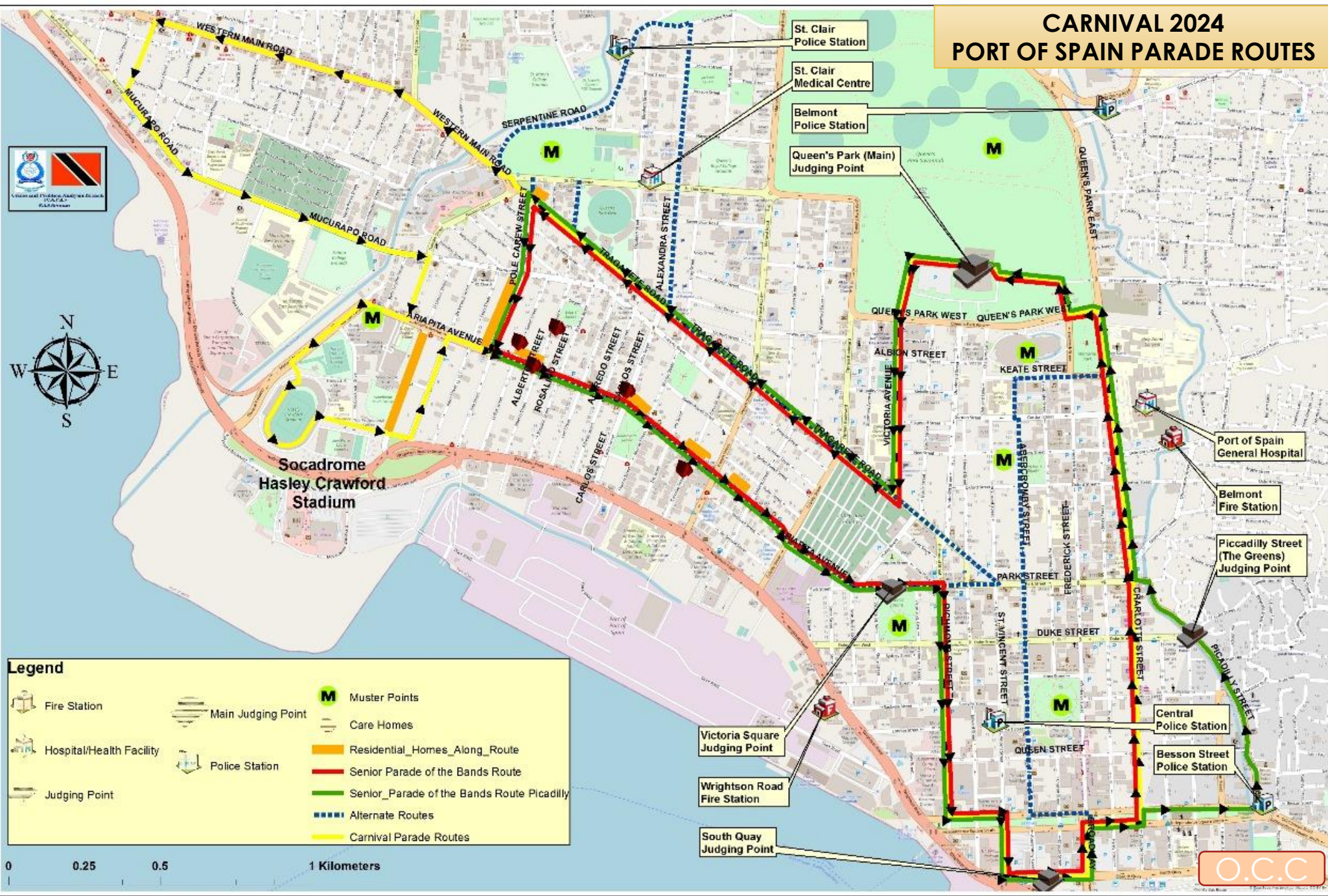

Bands will move from Ana Street,
Proceeding East along Ariapita Ave.,
On to Park Street,
Turn South along Richmond Street,
East on Independence Square North
South onto St. Vincent Street
East along South Quay,
Turn North on Charlotte Street,
Continue North along Charlotte Street,
Turn West on Queen's Park East,
Then North at Frederick Street to enter the Savannah.





Parade of the Band Route Con't

Having exited the Savannah, bands will:

Proceed South along Victoria Avenue

West along Tragarete Road,

South on to Pole Carew Street,

On to Ana Street to Ariapita Avenue,

Bands wishing to go to the Piccadilly Street (The Greens) judging point will proceed

East along Independence Square North,

Turn North onto Piccadilly Street (around the bridge),

West on to Park Street,

North along Charlotte Street,

Then West on Queen's Park East to enter the Savannah.

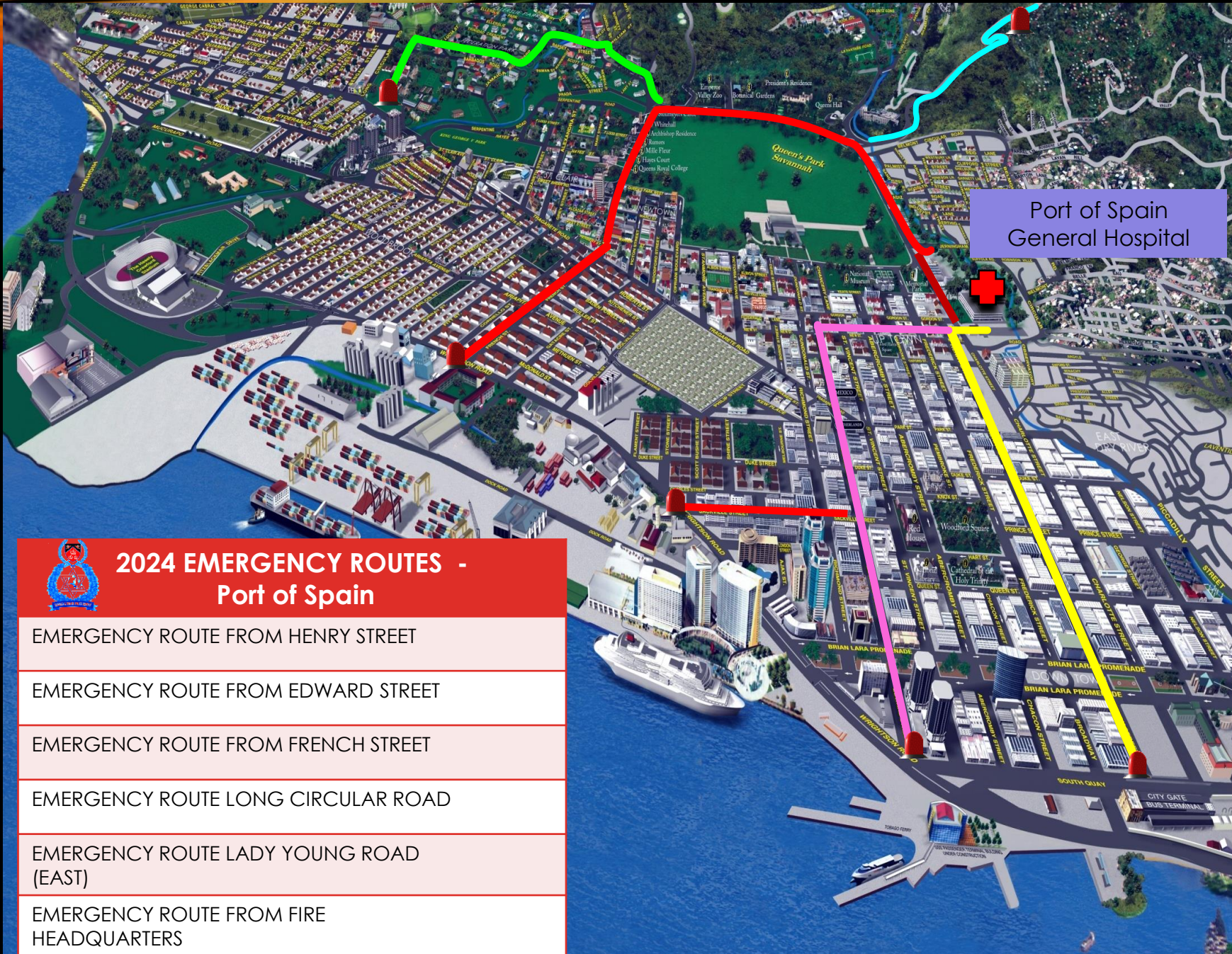
4. One Emergency Routes from the East

- ❖ East onto Sackville Street, North onto Edward Street, East onto New Street and into the Port of Spain General Hospital via Main Entrance





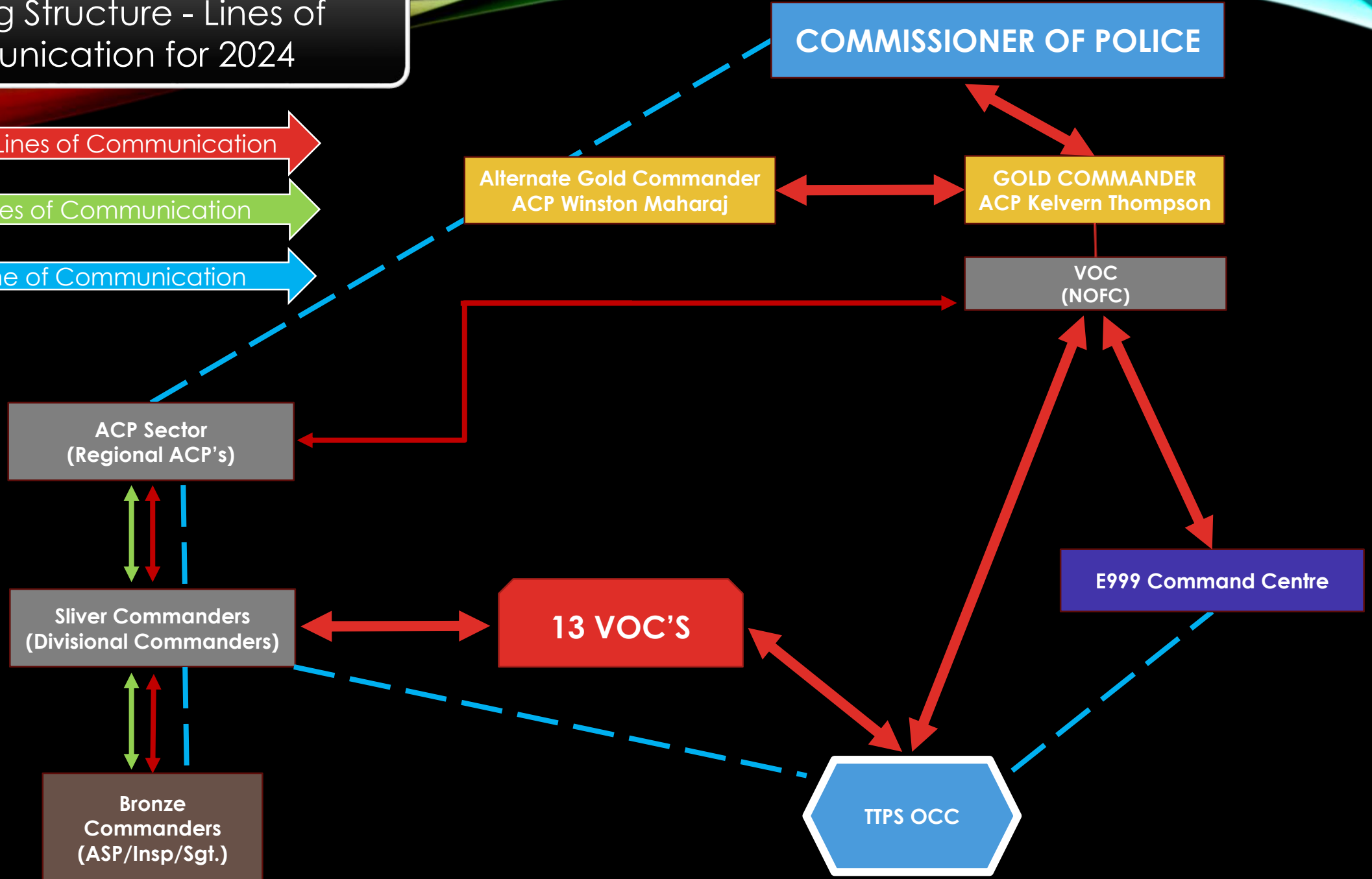

PUBLIC ORDER SECURITY LAYOUT

Public Order Team (1) – Woodbrook Secondary School

: This team will be based at the Woodbrook Secondary School and would be performing foot patrols and would also respond to emergencies in the Ariapita Avenue, Down Town Port-of-Spain and the National Stadium.

Public Order Team (2) – Police Academy Guard Unit

: This team will be based at the Police Academy Guard Unit and would be performing standby duties and would also respond to emergencies in and around the St. James district, the Queens Park Savannah and Tragarete Road.

Public Order Team (3) – G.E.B. Base

: This team will be based at the Guard & Emergency Branch Base in Aranguez, and would be performing standby duties and would also respond to emergencies in all Divisions.

Public Order Team (4) – S.O.P.

: This team will be based at the Guard & Emergency Branch Southern Outpost in Police Administration Building South. This team would be performing standby duties and would also respond to emergencies in San Fernando.





COMMUNICATIONS (Operations Centre's)

- ❖ TTPS Operations Command Centre (OCC) which is located at Knowsely Building , Port of Spain will be established as the TTPS VOC Command for Carnival.
- ❖ 13 Venue Operations Centre's (VOC) established within the 10 Divisions, including 1 at CID, Joint Command and Traffic Branch.
- ❖ First Division Officer (FDO) at National Carnival Commission (TOC) located at the Queens Park Savannah.
- ❖ First Division Officer posted at the National Operations Fusion Centre (NOFC).
- ❖ Executive Officers in charge of the six (6) Zones in POS.
- ❖ The NOFC VOC will be activated at 2:00am on Monday 12th February,2024
- ❖ The NOFC VOC will be deactivated by 8:00am on Wednesday 14th February,2024



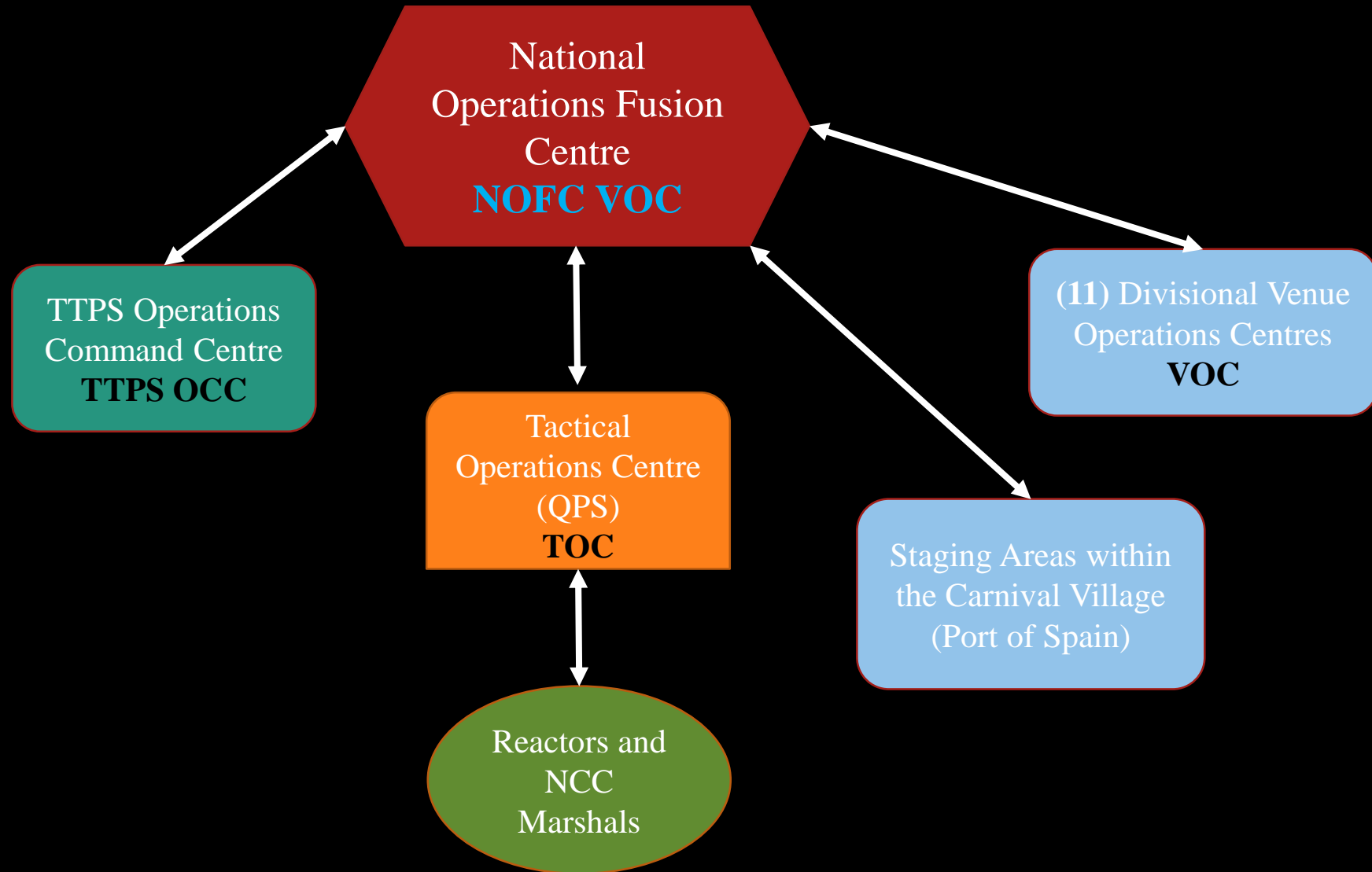

TTPS MANAGEMENT FOR POSSIBLE MASS CASUALTY INCIDENTS

- ❖ Each zone is under the supervision of an ACP who at this Stage will assume responsibility as the 'Incident Commander'.
- ❖ Potential threats or incidents within the zones will be managed depending on the type and impact of the incident.
- ❖ Each zone in Port of Spain has a designated staging area that is outfitted with wireless and telephone communications.
- ❖ The staging area is under the control of the TTPS and can be used as Temporary Command Post (TCP).
- ❖ Response:
 1. The impact area will be cordoned off and the crowd redirected to adjacent streets and parks designated as Muster Points. Further evacuation with assistance from PTSC if required.
 2. The emergency routes may be used to assist in pushing the crowd away from the impact area.
 3. The impact area will be secured and sanitized. TTPS Corporate Comms/ NCC publicize restricted areas via social media in the first instance.





BANDS REST STOP ACCESS ROUTES /RESTRICTIONS

To facilitate the health and safety needs of bands, the following access routes were authorized with restrictions:-

- ❖ **St Clair Avenue will be designated a one way proceeding West.**
- ❖ **No Music Truck** will be allowed to go to the rest stops. All music trucks will use St. Clair Avenue which is the designated access route.
- ❖ **All Bands proceeding west along Tragarete** can access their rest stops north of Tragarete Road via Alexandra Street and return via said street to St. Clair Avenue
- ❖ **Bands can also access their rest stops (Mandela Park etc.)** via Havelock and return to the route via Kavanagh Street
- ❖ **All Bands proceeding east along Ariapita Avenue** and wishing to access their rest stops north of Tragarete Road can use Carlos street via Alexandra Street.





Critical Infrastructure Port of Spain Division

Critical Infrastructures identified within the Division are:

- ❖ WASA at the following locations: Treatment Plant at Beetham Highway; Lady Young Road opp. Hilton; Hololo Mountain Road; Pitman Lane Gonzales; St Ann's Main Road; Old Carlton Savannah Hotel; Fondes Amandes Road St Ann's & Rapsey Street St Clair.
- ❖ T&TEC: Car park at Belmont Police Station; Western Main Road in the vicinity of Harvard's Sports Club.
