## Care for girls that are victims of sexual violence in the States Party to the Belém do Pará Convention

The Committee of Experts of the Follow-Up Mechanism to the Belém do Pará Convention (MESECVI) has recommended that the States Party to the Convention:

Adopt and implement care protocols for girls that are victims of violence, in indigenous languages and sign language when needed, within the police or other institutions that receive complaints, district attorney's offices and health services.

According to the information compiled by the MESECVI through 2016, the situation is:

In this context, the Committee of Experts recommends:

- Training agents of the State from the justice and health sectors in the comprehensive care that should be provided to girls that are victims of sexual violence, from a gender and human rights perspective;
- Ensuring that all protocols guarantee access to sexual and reproductive health services for all girls, regardless of their age, and include confidentiality (comprising the parents when they are the alleged abusers) and counselling; and
- Adopting care protocols that determine the steps to follow for treatment and care of girls that are users of emergency contraception and Post-Exposure Prophylaxis for HIV and other STIs in public health services, particularly in cases of sexual violence.
