N.° 18.398.





SCENE:

- **√400** ships
- **√1,500 tugboats**
- **√19.000** hopper barges
- √ 67 million tonnes (cargo without containers) and 690 thousand TEUs (cargo in containers, such as grains and its deritives, soybeans, oils, minerals, iron ore,
- fertilizers, and fuels). √ 105 ports/port terminals (29 in San **Lorenzo and Rosario** agro-export systems).


MARITIME SCENE

✓2056 Vessels (comprising of vessels for overseas storage, fishing, (jarters and freezers) passengers, tankers and container transportation.

✓18 million tonnes of cargo (grains and cereal by-products, fruits and vegetables, aluminum, fuels, and fish)

✓ 25 ports / port terminals
