Instituto Não Aceito Corrupção is a non-profit organization that was incorporated in São Paulo, Brazil on July 27, 2015. Its mission is fourfold: research, public policy, education, and mobilization of society, using specific data to conduct in-depth, critical, and qualified discussions on laws and proposed laws, in order to contribute to the construction and improvement of standards.

The objectives of *Instituto Não Aceito Corrupção* are to contribute to the construction of public anti-corruption policies, conduct scientific research into corruption, and mobilize society around education and anti-corruption.

Instituto Não Aceito Corrupção obtains financing through contributions from members, grants and donations in cash or in kind, official aid, and subsidies of any kind.
