The information contained in this report is in response to resolution CP/RES. 759 (1217/99) "Guidelines for the Participation of Civil Society Organizations in OAS Activities." This document includes a summary and list of documentation presented by *Centro de Desarrollo de la Mujer Negra Peruana (CEDEMUNEP)*, in accordance with the aforementioned Guidelines.

1. Background

Centro de Desarrollo de la Mujer Negra Peruana (CEDEMUNEP) is a non-profit organization founded in Lima, Peru, on December 3, 1997, with a mission is to promote the rights of Afro-descendant populations, with particular emphasis on Afro-Peruvian women and gender equity and equality, through the execution of programs to strengthen their socio-economic, organizational, and political development.

CEDEMUNEP projects revolve around fostering the integral development, cultural identity, and participation of Afro-Peruvian women in the decision-making processes, and non-discrimination and prevention of violence against them.

CEDEMUNEP finances its activities through contributions from various organizations and foundations, among them the W. K. Kellogg Foundation, Match International Centre, Italian International Cooperation, Inter-American Foundation, Global Rights, and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

CEDEMUNEP submitted its request for registration with the OAS on April 8, 2009.

3. Primary areas of activity of the CSO and their relationship to OAS activities

CEDEMUNEP promotes the human rights of Afro-descendant populations and black women and its activities are related to the objectives of the OAS in the following areas:

- Promoting and strengthening community organizational capacity of Afro-descendant communities; and
- Eradicating all forms of discrimination and violence against the Afro-descendant population.

4. CSO contributions that could be of interest to the OAS

CEDEMUNEP carries out its activities by undertaking programs and workshops for analysis, training, and reflection. Among the organization's contributions that could be of interest to the OAS are:

- Promotion of networking by civil society organizations engaged with Afro-descendant populations to strengthen the leadership of Afro-Peruvian women;
- Monitoring of living conditions of Afro-descendant women in Peru;
- Designing and executing educational programs and workshops, to promote awareness about the human rights of Afro-descendant populations and the eradication of all forms of discrimination; and
- Providing advice on the development and implementation of public policies that foster the integral development of Afro-descendant populations.

CEDEMUNEP believes its activities could be useful for the work of the various agencies and subsidiary bodies of the OAS in the following areas:

- Collaborating with the Department of International Affairs (DIA) of the Secretariat for External Relations (SER) in promoting civil society participation in OAS activities relating to Afro-descendant populations; and

• Assisting the Working Group to Prepare the Draft Inter-American Convention against Racism and All Forms of Discrimination and Intolerance, of the OAS Permanent Council's Committee on Juridical and Political Affairs (CAJP).
