1. Background

Eudes Foundation is a nonprofit organization founded in 1999 to provide comprehensive medical care, rehabilitation, nutritional advice, and psychological support to more than 450 low-income persons suffering from HIV/AIDS. Its head office is in Mexico City, Mexico.

The *Eudes Foundation* is funded via direct contributions from members, revenue from health care services, and grants from enterprises and organizations, such as: Fundación BEST, Fundación Grupo Lala, Fundación Vamos México, Fundación J.P Morgan, Instituto Nacional de Desarrollo Social (INDESOL), Bimbo, Instituto Mexicano de Doctrina Social Cristiana, Fomento Social Banamex, Instituto de Asistencia e Integración Social, and others.

3. Primary areas of activity of the CSO and their relationship to OAS activities

The areas of the *Eudes Foundation*'s endeavors that are related to OAS activities include:

- Fostering dialogue between the government and civil society aimed at constructing a human rights agenda;
