I. Mentimeter Instructive

What is Mentimeter and what is it used for?

Mentimeter is an interactive presentation tool that enables users to participate in surveys, quizzes, and other activities in real-time using their mobile devices or computers. It is ideal for meetings, conferences, training sessions, and any other event where active and open participation from the audience is desired. With Mentimeter, participants' responses are submitted anonymously, facilitating a more open interaction.

How to Participate in a Mentimeter Activity

1. Login to Mentimeter

The moderator will project onto the live webcast screen the Mentimeter presentation with instructions and activity questions. Have your device ready. Once it's displayed on the screen, you'll have two options to join:

- 1. You can join via www.menti.com from your mobile device or computer, without the need to download any application or create an account.
- 2. The moderator will display a QR code on the screen that you can scan with your device or computer.

If you're connecting from your computer and do not scan the QR code, enter the code 5506 5032 and click "Submit." This code will also be provided to you by the presenter during the activity.

2. Interacting with Ouestions

Once you enter the presentation containing the questions, follow the instructions and wait for the moderator to activate the questions. The moderator will enable the questions one by one. You will have time to respond to each question.

Answer the questions that appear on your screen. There will be questions with open-ended responses. You can submit as many answers as you deem necessary for each question, but only during the time that the moderator has the question displayed, in real-time.

Submit your responses following the on-screen instructions. You will be able to view the results in real-time by observing responses from other participants. As the presenter updates the questions on the screen, the corresponding response option will be enabled on your device.

3. Tips for Better Participation

Keep your device connected to the Internet during the Mentimeter presentation.

Participate honestly and respectfully, keeping in mind that all answers are valid. The audience will be able to see the variety of answers that participants leave.
